Do you need help with your asthma?

MASH supports people and families affected by asthma in Medway. We aim to improve awareness and understanding of asthma, its triggers and treatment and to empower people with asthma to self manage their condition. All of our services are free and open to all. Our asthma nurse can provide advice and support with asthma, discuss medications, asthma reviews and personalised asthma action plans. Letters containing the advice given and any recommendations are given to clients to forward to their GPs. At our face-to-face appointments we offer spirometry ad FeNO testing for asthma diagnosis and monitoring and airborne allergy testing.
